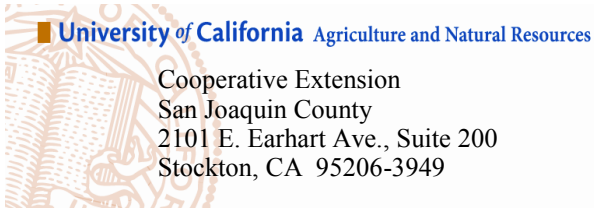

- Ways to reduce the risk of contamination
- How to conduct a self-audit and develop a food safety plan for your farm
