

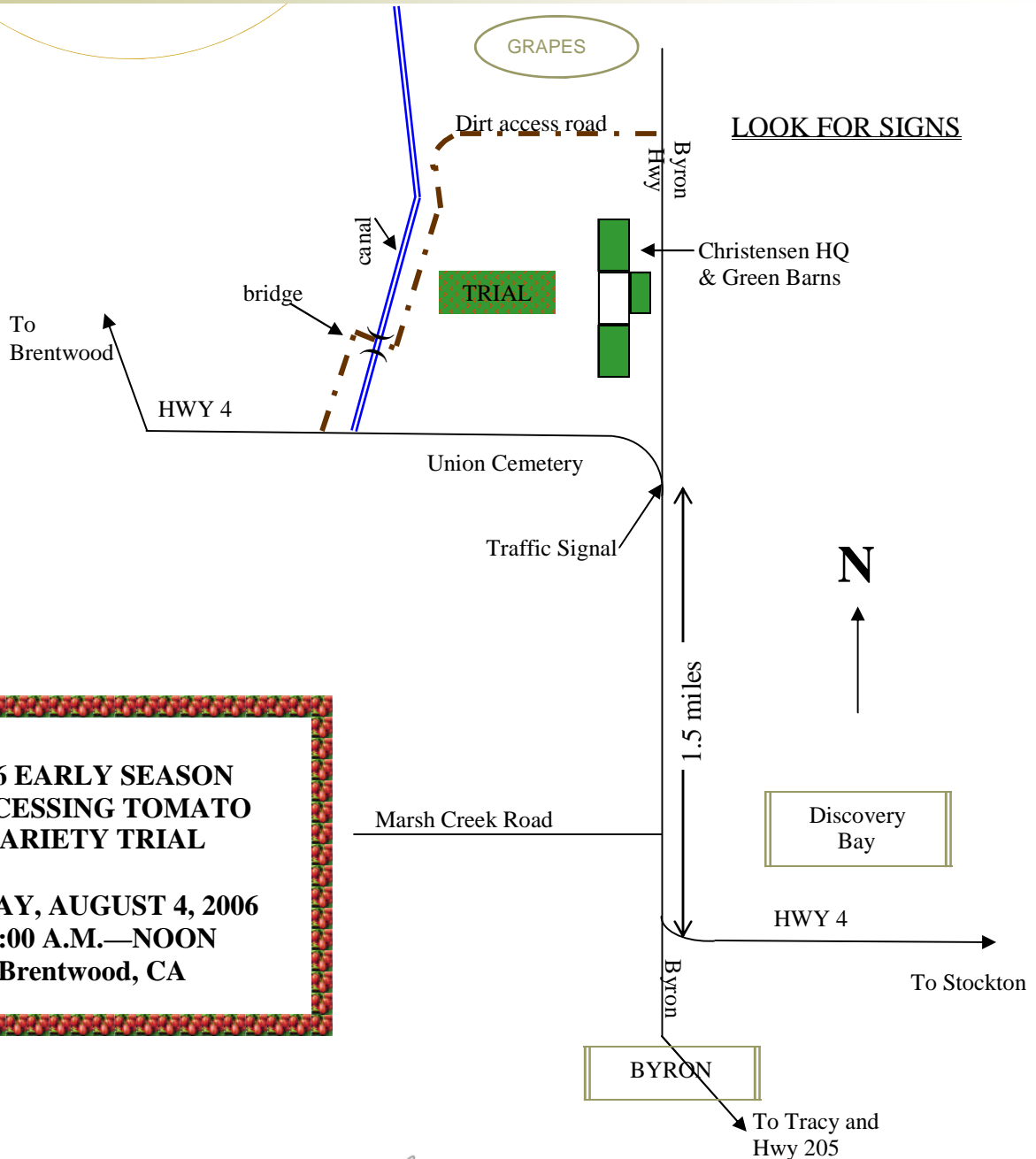

You're invited to attend the early season maturity processing tomato variety trial Field Day. This variety trial is part of the statewide trial program coordinated and conducted by University of California Cooperative Extension to evaluate and compare new and established processing tomato varieties over a wide geographical area. There are 12 replicated lines in the trial representing six seed companies.

The trial was planted as seed at Simoni and Massoni Farms near the north junction of Hwy 4 and Byron Highway (near Union Cemetery) on March 27, 2006. The soil type is a Brentwood clay loam. Stop by and take a look at the differences in vine growth and crop maturity among these variety trial entries. Everyone is welcome.
