

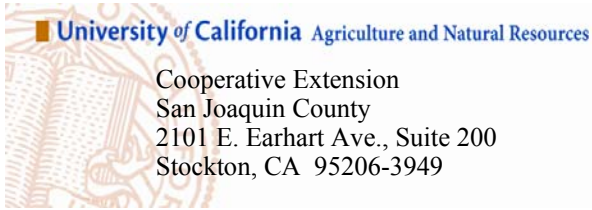
Low Emissions Nut Harvesting Field Day
