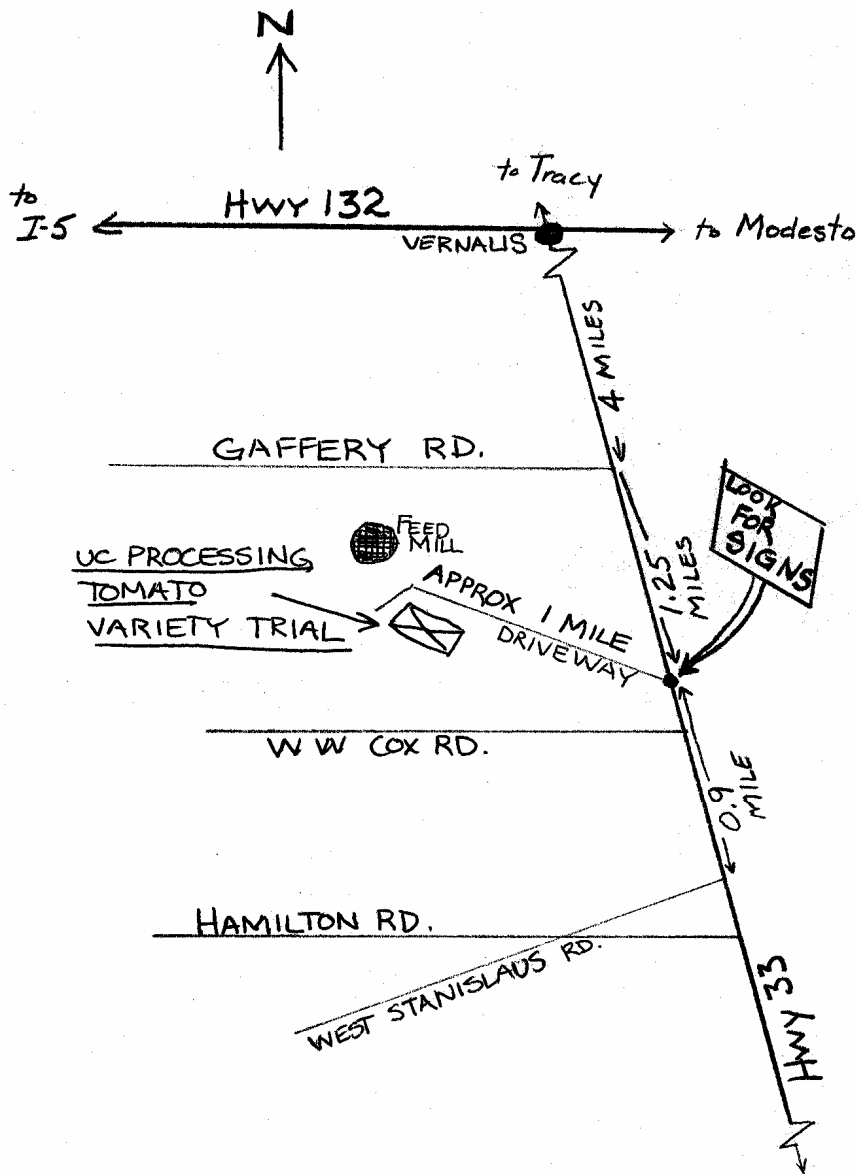
2004 UCCE STANISLAUS COUNTY AND SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY MIDSEASON PROCESSING TOMATO VARIETY TRIAL FIELD DAY

10:00 A.M. -- TUESDAY, AUGUST 17, 2004

The trial is located at Cox and Perez Farms (Bill and Chuck Cox) off Hwy 33 and northwest of the ranch headquarters.

If coming from Westley go north on Hwy 33, cross West Stanislaus Road and go 0.9 mile to the turnoff (look for the signs). The driveway goes off to the northwest from Hwy 33 for about 1 mile to an old feed mill and the trial is located just south of the mill by the irrigation canal.

If coming from Vernalis off Hwy 132, go south on Hwy 33 for 4 miles and cross Gaffery Road, then go another 1.25 miles on Hwy 33 to the turnoff (look for the signs) and proceed to the northwest on the drive as described above. (See map for details).



The trial was transplanted on double row 66-inch beds April 30, 2004 and received its first irrigation about 8 or 9 days later. The trial contains 18 varieties in the replicated trial block and another 12 lines in the single replication observation block. The trial is rapidly approaching maturity and there is some disease pressure in the field, which will be discussed at the field day. So take a few minutes from your busy day and stop by the trial.
