Walnut dieback caused by the fungal pathogen *Botryosphaeria* ('Bot' for short) has attracted much attention in recent years, and is the subject of a very intensive research effort by UC scientists. The focus will be on identifying Bot symptoms in the orchard and current suggested treatment options for affected orchards. This meeting is open to all. 
